NATIONAL PATHFINDER SCHOLARSHIP FUND



The National Federation of Republican Women established the National Pathfinder Scholarship Fund in 1985 in honor of First Lady Nancy Reagan.

Three annual scholarships of \$2,500 each are available to provide financial assistance and support to young students seeking undergraduate or postgraduate degrees.

THE NFRW ESTABLISHED THIS SCHOLARSHIP FUND IN SEPTEMBER OF 1995 IN HONOR OF NFRW PAST PRESIDENT BETTY RENDEL'S EXTRAORDINARY LEADERSHIP SKILLS AND DEDICATION TO THE REPUBLICAN PARTY.

THE THREE ANNUAL SCHOLARSHIPS OF \$1,000 ARE DESIGNED FOR UNDERGRADUATE STUDENTS WHO ARE MAJORING IN POLITICAL SCIENCE, GOVERNMENT OR ECONOMICS.

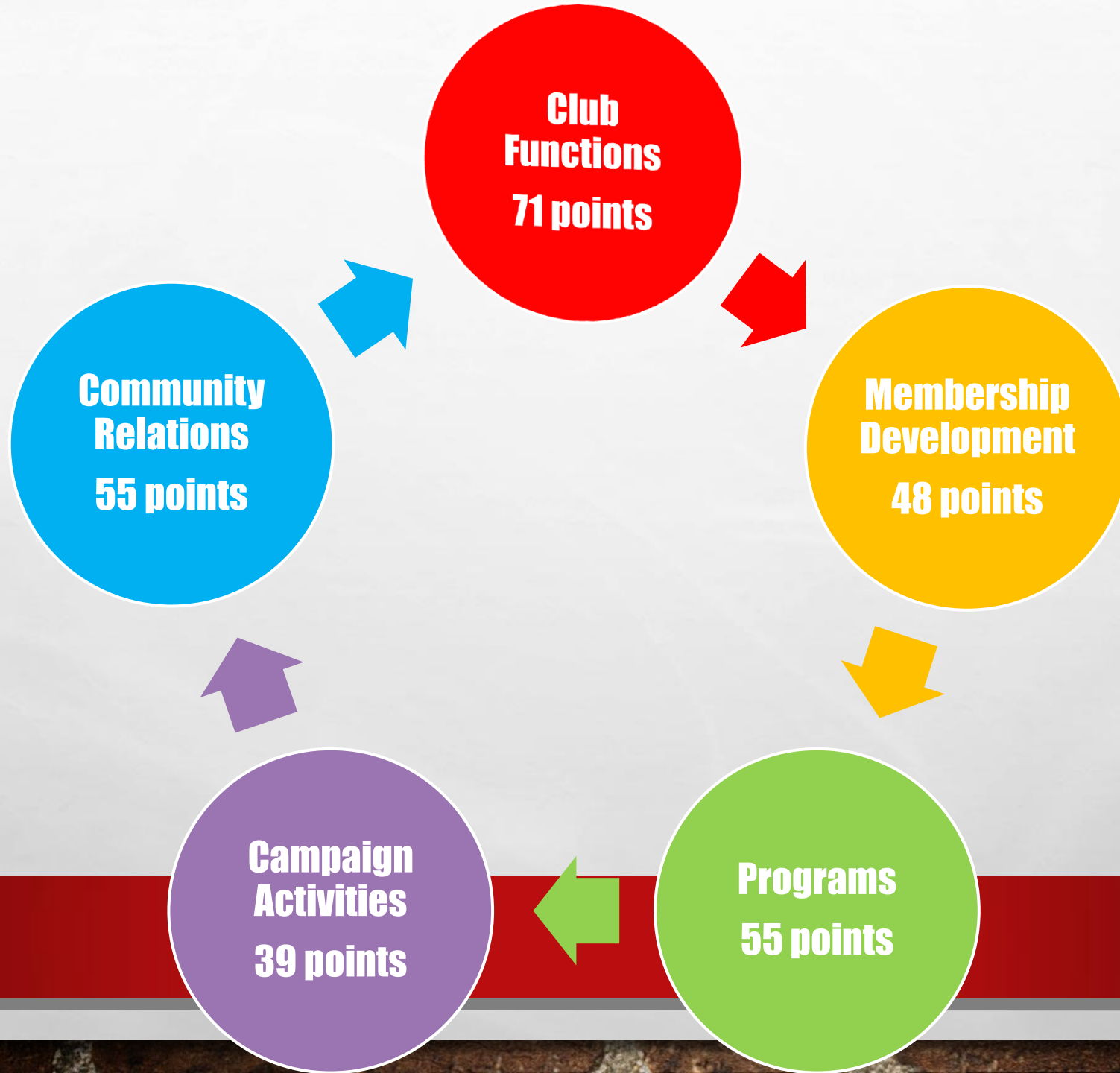
Each year, the program offers three young women the opportunity to spend six weeks in our nation's capitol working in the headquarters of the country's foremost women's partisan political organization.
